Executive Summary

SoundCafe Leicester (SCL) is a registered charity providing a safe creative space for adults who are homeless, at risk of homelessness, vulnerable or socially isolated as a consequence of their living arrangements.

SCL offers opportunities to promote feelings of well-being, confidence and self-esteem by enabling people to take part in creative activities such as singing together, poetry, crafts, drawing and painting.

Over 30 volunteers including Samaritans support SCL's work. Since the launch of SCL in October 2014 the numbers of people, our guests, attending have grown from 18 to over 40 per session.

SCL welcomes everyone regardless of race, religion, sexual orientation, gender or ability. SoundCafe provides the opportunity to explore the Christian faith for those who wish to do so.

SoundCafe's Patrons are: the Bishop of Leicester, the Rt Rev Martyn Snow; Mrs Janet Arthur; and Cllr Manjula Sood, Assistant City Mayor.

Other supporters include: The West Leicester Mission Partnership, St. Martin's House, Leicester Cathedral, The Samaritans and Groby Sings.

The trustees of SCL include those with experience of working with rough sleepers, long term homeless, socially isolated people, those with drug or mental health issues and those who are destitute. This experience has shown us that we need to provide creative solutions to meet the diverse needs of those who are or were once homeless.

Homelessness and the effects of it cannot be solved by a short term stay in a hostel nor by one organisation. Therefore, SCL is planning a development of a range of services and opportunities:

- café sessions
- · a choir combining the talents of guests and volunteers
- · arts and crafts expression
- finding a voice through poetry, art and music
- raising the profile and awareness of homelessness

SCL is aware of similar projects work in other parts of the UK and know that with the right support and backing we can offer respect, dignity and security to those suffering from and surviving homelessness in Leicester.

Activities Report - Operational matters by SCL's vice-chair and Chaplain

SoundCafe Choir

SoundCafe Choir have had another amazing year. We spent much of the first part of the year preparing for the Tapestry of Life festival which was held at Leicester Cathedral in the summer of 2017. The choir sang Joseph and his Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat as a finale to the whole days activities and were supported my members of Cantamici. This was a significant step for the choir in terms of the complexity of the piece and the skills needed to sing it which shows just how much the choir has developed over the three years it has been running. the cathedral was full for the free concert and the audience were encouraged to join in the singing and the celebration of the day which was a great success.



There was not much time to take a break after this epic event as SoundCafe then performed at The Y Theatre in Leicester as part of the Musicians against homelessness concert, a charity concert which invited semi-professional bands to perform to raise awareness about homelessness. This was a huge success and SoundCafe sang to great acclaim, again supported by members of Cantamici.





The time since these two big outings has been spent building the expertise of the choir to be able to sing without any accompaniment which gives the choir greater flexibility in terms of what they can sing and where. SoundCafe also has been building its relationship with Leicester Cathedral and now regularly rehearses in the cathedral to enable the choir to experience the excellent acoustic and ambience of the building. This has without doubt improved the singing and the professional approach to their singing and performance.

What has been exciting to see over the last year is not just the increase in numbers of the choir (it now has over 30 singers that attend regularly) but the increased confidence and self esteem of the singers. SoundCafe Choir now has a very strong identity as a choir that they know is held in high regard across the city and county. That is quite a remarkable thing to achieve in under less than 3 years. As this report is written the choir is preparing to sing in it's first open air performance on Good Friday as part of the Leicester at the Cross event in the city. As always the SoundCafe Choir are always up for the challenge in raising awareness about homelessness and being a voice for those who are marginalised in our society. Conducting this choir is a huge privilege.

Behind-the-scenes Activities this Year

September 2017 saw the first Growth Fund report submitted by SCL to Leicester Diocese. This was a key milestone as it brought together a summary analysis of the key work undertaken by SCL and its volunteers and truly demonstrated the difference that SCL makes to the lives of its' guests. The resourcing of a development Worker post was focused on: to oversee, develop and grow the vision of SoundCafe... to strengthen links with other city agencies... enable the ministries of the Cathedral... who can co-ordinate and develop it and enable the dreams and visions for the future to happen.

With the appointment of a Development Worker at the end of 2016 we have:

- Developed and approved working policies in respect of Lone Working; Safeguarding; Equality & Diversity and Data Protection embracing the new recommendations of the new General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR).
- Volunteer support; weekly communication sessions; designated training and a new volunteer handbook issued in June 2017.
- Introduced new monitoring and evaluation methods for understanding the numbers of guests attending sessions; their 'homeless history'; current housing and health challenges. This is providing a sound basis for our future development and plans to ensure we address the needs of our guest group.



Developed an annual calendar for SoundCafe sessions, including speciality sessions which this year have focused on saints festivals; other cultures feasts; and specific days including Homeless Sunday; Racial Justice day; and World Poetry day.

A key emphasis on our work throughout the year has been giving the opportunity for our guests to 'find a voice' through singing, poetry and art. This was made possible through our Arts Festival, Musicians Against Homelessness and working with the Y.

SoundCafe choir performed at the service for the Archbishop of Canterbury and Christmas 2017 saw the choir undertake a carol-a-thon in the Cathedral which was aimed at raising awareness of the challenges facing people who are: homeless; on the edge of society; and fleeing oppression. It also saw the choir as an integral part of the cathedral and gave guests an identity and belief in their own self-worth. A bid for resources enabled the purchase of t-shirts for all choir members which gave the choir a corporate identity.











Over 2017 SoundCafe has worked with the Cathedral on a number of events and the theme of 'Home' at Advent provided an opportunity to work in partnership displaying the work of our guests and sharing the message of Christmas and the place of home. The choir now regularly rehearse in the Cathedral and have been welcomed into this setting by staff and visitors alike.

Achievements and Outcomes / Benefits

In excess of 40 guests regularly attend SoundCafe, the highest number attending to date in any one session has been 52. The benefits however extend beyond numbers, to that of transforming people's lives and giving our guests the confidence and self esteem to value what they do and be able to perform in a public setting.

Our guests have commented on the benefits of attending SoundCafe as follows:

'There is a lovely atmosphere at SoundCafé. I love the music and the poetry, especially when we all sing together, and I have made some new friends. It helps me to feel less lonely and more confident in talking to people. It lifts me up.'

'I enjoy all the music, and I look forward to coming to SoundCafé because it is welcoming and helps me to feel a bit less isolated. It gives some structure to my week, and I feel I can offload here and still be accepted.'

'Coming to SoundCafé has made me more confident and encouraged me to look after myself better so I feel healthier.'

'One thing Soundcafe has taught me is that the healing power of talking is immensely strong.'

'There is a lovely welcome here, and I feel more peaceful after I have been. Being able to stand up and read my poetry here has been a real learning experience.'

'It is very relaxed so you can be yourself here for a couple of hours, and I have made some new friends. Singing in the cathedral especially was a great night. I now help out with setting up, and I get a lot of satisfaction from being able to do something myself.'

There are also key benefits to our volunteers for example for some it gives them purpose to their week; combats loneliness; and our volunteer training enhances skills and opportunities for working together.

Our volunteers have said

'I'm giving something back to society and it makes me realise how lucky I am'

'Because it lifts my spirits and its lovely to see all our guests happy'

Jound Case

Notes to accompany the Financial Report – March 10 2017 – March 09 2018 – presented to the Trustees of SoundCafe Leicester on 3rd July 2018.

A total of £53542 was received in the 12 months from March 10 2017 – March 09 2018 The net result was an increase of receipts over payments, of which with the funds carried over from the previous year, amounts to £66597 to carry forward on 10 March 2018.

Of these funds, £33297 is classed as unrestricted and £33300 as restricted

The accounts have been prepared on an Income and Expenditure basis in accordance with the 'Charities Statement of Recommended Practice'

Funding

As we were fortunate to receive a three year grant from the Leicester Diocese Board of Finance, we have been able to employ a Development Worker for three days a week. With her expertise and enthusiasm she has had an extremely positive effect on the running of the charity.

The balance of matched funding needed to match this Growth Fund Grant was received from the Henry Smith Charity. We now need to secure matched funding of 13500 to secure the third year of the Development Worker from November 2018.

We were also fortunate in receiving £16000 from the Leicester Adult School Union in order to extend our Drama and Arts and Crafts activities.

Reserve Policy

It is the intention of SoundCafe Leicester to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds of three months operating costs, which equates to £8000. This will be reviewed in the summer months.

Investment Policy

Apart from maintaining the Reserve Fund the majority of the charity's unrestricted funds are to be spent in the short time on our charitable objectives. After discussions with the trustees it was decided that we would not invest any of these funds at the moment.

Trustees Remuneration and Related Party Transactions

No member of the Trustee Board received any remuneration or travel costs during the year. No trustee or any person related to them had any personal interest in any transaction entered into by the charity during the year.

Assets

SoundCafe Leicester owns no land, building, furniture, investments or trading stock.

We own a small amount of equipment, necessary for the running of the Charity but this has little financial value and is treated as expenditure in the year of purchase.

Volunteers

We are really grateful to our volunteers, guest helpers and Samaritans who work tirelessly to make SoundCafe Leicester such a creative, welcoming and diverse charity. At the moment we are still not in a position to repay the expenses of volunteers, guest helpers or Samaritans.

Liabilities

At the end of this financial year there was a liability for one week of the Development Worker's salary. This amounted to £301.20 and will be paid at the end of March 2018.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF SOUNDCAFE LEICESTER CIO

I report on the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 9th March 2018.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiners

Summary Report from the Chair of Trustees: Looking ahead

As always SoundCafe Leicester has "punched above its' weight" and we have achieved so much in this year. A HUGE well done to all who have made this happen. I am **so** proud of them all. We are really grateful to our volunteers and guest-helpers who work so hard to make SoundCafe Leicester such a welcoming, diverse and creative charity.

Looking ahead – on the horizon we can see the possibility of becoming a broader organisation in what we do and how we do this and in how we are supported. Our Business Plan is developing as I write and we hope to branch out eventually beyond meeting once a week. We would love to be able to offer more targeted services on different days to try to meet the needs of Guests. The challenge is always to pace ourselves and to find the funding appropriate to our development. For example, invitations for our choir to perform must be carefully considered – otherwise guests and volunteers will stop enjoying and benefitting from the performance aspect of SoundCafe.

We also recognise the need to be constantly supporting and recruiting volunteers, so we hope we can develop two teams and improve our way of coordinating what the volunteers do and how they do it. In this way we want to ensure they are well supported and don't find themselves over-burdened. Equally we need to boost the Trustee board and we are actively seeking more Trustees with specific skills and experience.





SoundCafe's Arts and Crafts

SoundCafe Arts & Crafts section has developed over the last 12 months. "Tapestry of Life Festival" in July 2017 provided a showcase for everyone who visited Leicester Cathedral to experience the Crafts, Artwork and Poetry so ably produced and demonstrated by our Guests.

Handmade crafts and other small items were available at our first sales table event in February 2018. This was suggested and run by one of our SoundCafe Guests who was supported by a Volunteer from the Arts/Crafts section. This proved to be popular and well received with requests for this to continue in the future.

Guests who regularly visit the Arts/Crafts section are being encouraged by volunteers to work together in developing their own particular interests and to continue enjoying each others' company and friendship.

SoundCafe Leicester's Guests' Poetry

Aims of the "Writing/Poetry Table"

Making Writing Available to Everyone: Creative writing and other Arts give SoundCafe Guests a voice, which has often been denied them in the past. SoundCafe enables a democratisation of the Arts, as a means of enjoyment, fulfilment and expression. SoundCafe is committed to enable Guests to have a voice. SoundCafe demonstrates that writing and other Arts are not just for a privileged, "cultured" few, but for all of us to enjoy and take part in.

In the past year, SoundCafe Guests have produced a considerable quantity of writing, mostly poems. The main aim of the "writing/poetry table" is to enable Guests to enjoy expressing themselves through poetry and prose. In addition, help has been given in the development and editing of writing. in response to some Guests' requests. Overall, Guests have produced work which is often very moving, and of a high standard. However, everyone is very welcome at the writing/poetry table, whether or not they decide to write.

Pictures to inspire poems, and anthologies of poetry are made available. In addition, "talking tablecloths" enable Guests to write or draw (and, for one Guest, compose music) to express their thoughts and feelings. Creative writing has extended beyond the writing/poetry table, with several Guests writing on other tables, and often also engaged in arts, crafts, singing, and playing musical instruments.

Specific Events and Projects

Several Guests have recently written poems on people experiencing homelessness. These have been converted into lyrics for several songs, which have been set to music by the Guest who suggested this project.

17 Guests wrote poems, or in a few instances, prose, for the SoundCafe "Tapestry of Life" Festival in Leicester Cathedral in July 2017. Work produced was displayed in the Cathedral, and read aloud by, or for, Guests. Guests participated actively in this event with other local, published, writers. SoundCafe are considering whether it is possible to publish a collection of Guests' visual artwork and poetry, to include work from the "Tapestry of Life" Festival.



Thanks to an idea of a SoundCafe volunteer, members of the public visiting the "Tapestry of Life" Festival were invited to write thoughts on luggage labels. These contributions, including five in various non-English languages, were incorporated into a "group poem". Poems have also been written for SoundCafe to remember people on National Holocaust Day, and those affected by the 1947 Partition of India.

Several Guests have participated in local poetry events, including Pinggg...K! WORD! and the People's Arts Collective (PAC). 7 Guests wrote poems which were read aloud to the audience in a PAC Arts event, as part of Everybody's Reading Festival, in Leicester Museum in October, 2017. Four of these poems were incorporated into a booklet. Two Guests also played musical instruments, and two actively helped with this event – an indicator of progress for Guests who often struggle with issues of confidence and self-esteem.

Future Work

Our plans include:

- Consideration of SoundCafe Guests' ideas for developing and publishing Guests' work.
- Recruitment of Guest Helpers and volunteers to facilitate and deputise when the main facilitator is away.
- In response to an idea from another SoundCafe volunteer, providing books, donated by volunteers and others, for Guests to borrow, and, perhaps, keep.

Thank You

I am inspired by the commitment of so many Guests to their writing, and by Liz Gray, who pioneered creative writing in SoundCafe from its inception, and has been our Poet in Residence. I am very grateful for the opportunity to help facilitate creative writing at SoundCafe. It is hard work, but very rewarding. I learn so much from Guests and other participants.
